SUPERIOR TO STONE

"Oh, Susan! Look! Look at the lion!", I expect you've seen someone put a lighted match to a bit of newspaper...and for a second nothing seems to have happened; and then you notice a tiny streak of flame creeping along the edge of the newspaper. It was like that now. For a second after Aslan had breathed upon him the stone lion looked just the same. Then a tiny streak of gold began to run along his white marble back then it spread-then the color seemed to lick all over him as the flame licks all over a bit of paper...Everywhere the statues were coming to life."¹ In C.S. Lewis' Narnia series, the life-giving Aslan transforms dead statues of stone into animals who are very much alive. Once the act is done, Aslan does not view one animal as superior to another, he gives each one a special assignment using each animal's gifts and abilities. The animals did not become superior to each other. However, they did become infinitely superior to their former stone selves.

Ernest Hemingway once said, "There is nothing noble in being superior to your fellow man; true nobility is being superior to your former self". Humans have spent countless amounts of blood, sweat, and tears attempting to prove themselves better than those around them. However, such a goal is not only a sad self-centered waste of time, it is also impossible. The reason it is impossible is because it simply will never be true. The same God who made one person, "knitting them together"² in their mother's womb is the same God who created everyone else for a purpose that is equally unique and important.

While proving "superior to your fellow man" is futile, becoming "superior to your former self" is, as the quote says, a "truly noble" aspiration. While this process of transformation and growth is something only God can do within a person, it also requires submission and obedience. Christians believe that becoming "superior to your former self" involves becoming a "new creature", as the famous verse says, "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. 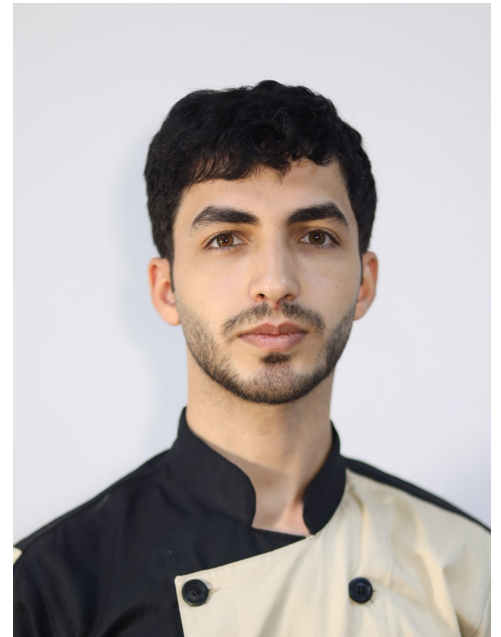

BIRTHDAY OF THE MONTH: JOSEPH PRIESTLEY: THE AIR WE BREATHE

One of the pioneers of modern ideology associated with the relationship between electricity and gasses came from humble beginnings and was part of a revolutionary group. Joseph Priestly was inspired by Benjamin Franklin to write and begin one of his first works. Coming from a background of rejecting common reformation Christian beliefs, he aligned this practical mindset to his pursuit of scientific exploration. It was through his experiments on the state of nature that he found a belief in the created world only able to be formed from a benevolent God. It was with this new foundation that he saw science only pointed towards the existence of God. He later joined a group of scientists and started work trying to find medical relief for common illnesses. It is because of this pursuit that we now have the carbonated water that is used in modern soda. However, his next experiment was more revolutionary.

He developed an experiment conducted by many scientists and came to describe the active element in combustion and respiration. In 1780, Joseph Priestly discovered the element Oxygen. This launched the scientific world into a new understanding of the air around them and the nature of basic earthly things, such as fire. Priestly continued to keep his ideological expressions and question his new findings to find more evidence and explanation to further prove this new element. This was not the only revolutionary concept he was part of. Priestly was also involved in a group that promoted freedom of speech, worship, and education, as these are requirements for correct and faultless scientific results. His ideas were met with hostility in England as he fled to the Americas to be among others who were mindful of freedom and revolutionary ideas. He was later revered by the third president of the United States upon his death and mourned by many as a great scientist and influential leader in the freedom of ideas.

The Social Workers team will have a one-on-one session with students to try and identify the cause of the difficulty and bring forth solutions on how to deal with it.

Each section of the school's Social Workers team is also responsible for hosting a monthly theme to spread awareness on topics such as respect, trust, bullying, and basic behavioral issues. At CSM, the Social Workers team serve as pillars of the school, working hand-in-hand with teachers, parents, and administration staff to ensure that each student receives the best educational experience.



IOWA ASSESSMENTS: FOCUSING FOR THE FUTURE

On the morning of March 6th, the day for which many admin, staff, teachers, and students prepared for had arrived: IOWA Assessments. At approximately 8:15 in the morning, 232 students from 6th grade and 163 students from 8th grade sat in their seats across the Duhok, Erbil, and Suly campuses, ready for their exam.

In addition to demonstrating their skills in subjects such as Reading, Vocabulary, Grammar, Spelling, Math, and Computation, students also learned the new skill of filling in "bubbles". In preparation for AP Exams later in life, students learned how to record their answers by using a separate answer sheet and coloring in the "bubble" representing the correct multiple-choice answer.

Perhaps more challenging than the content of the exam was the limited amount of time to complete each question. Part of the test was to determine how quickly students could produce the correct answer with confidence and move on to the next question. Proctors announced the time limit for each separate section, alerting students as to how much time was remaining throughout the exam.

In order to keep students energized, snacks and a hearty lunch were served by the cafeteria staff. Thanks to the diligent direction of the staff, students exited exam halls, finished their food, and were back in their seats ready for the afternoon sections in a record amount of time. CSM is hopeful that this experience will help prepare students for AP Exams of the future and that the results will provide helpful guidance for teachers as well as students to know which areas of study may require more focus.



NEWROZ: THE CELEBRATION OF NEW BEGINNINGS

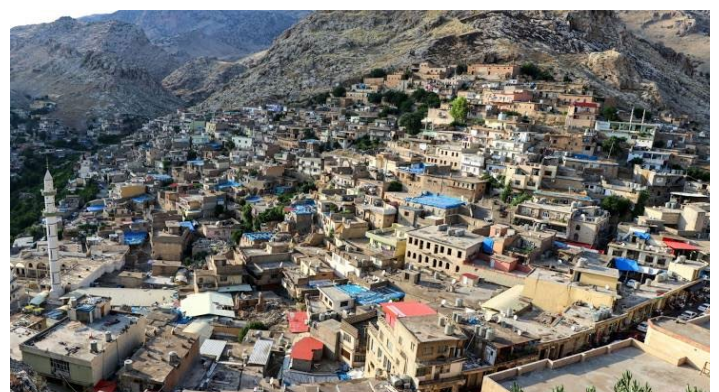

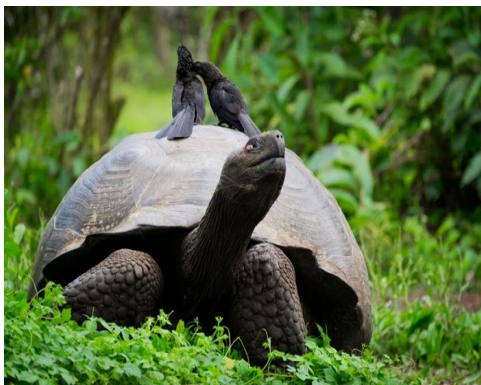


A Shrimp's Heart Is in Its Head

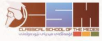

KURDISH CLOTHES CEREMONY: AN ARRAY OF APPAREL AND ARRIVAL OF SPRING

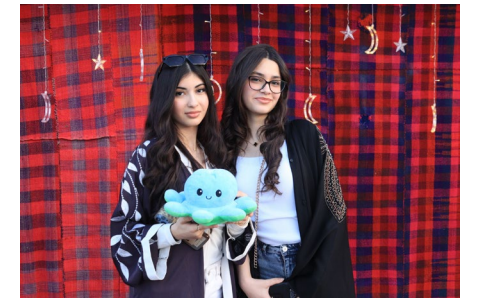
